### **A Message from Our Sheriff**

Howdy Pilgrims,

As we Arizonians entered into a new centennial in the year 1900, America was at peace. The Spanish-American War had ended just two years earlier. Coca-Cola was the best-known product in America and it still contained cocaine and was sold at drugstore soda fountains everywhere. Drugstores also carried marijuana, heroin and morphine. The leading causes of death were pneumonia, influenza, tuberculosis, diarrhea, heart disease and stroke. Las Vegas, Nevada, had a population of 30. Arizona was still a territory and, in this year (of 1900) the State Capitol was completed, costing \$135,744. There were 5,544 residents in the infant town of Phoenix (Marshall "A Hundred Summers"), and 3559 in Prescott. Just a thought to keep things in perspective, speaking of which, our May speakers are our own Nancy Burgess and John Krizek who will give us a photographic tour of 1916 Prescott, AZ. You'll love it!
