# **After Dinner Program**

"The History of the Prescott Fire Department: 1885 to the Here and Now"

**Presenter: Conrad Jackson** 

Learn how the Prescott Fire Department came to be established, why it changed from a volunteer department to a paid one, and background on the impactful fires that our community has endured. Conrad's historical journey includes photos and stories beginning in the 1800's depicting the department's 137-year history.

Conrad Jackson has spent 28 years in the fire service, 20 of them as a firefighter with the Prescott Fire Department. While serving on the PFD, he wrote his book about the department's history which secured him the role as its historian. Recently retired, he achieved his goal of over 10,000 responses with the PFD.
