“The Path of Light: Wisdom from a  
Nineteenth-Century Navajo Shepherd”

Presenter: Harvey Leake

Non-indigenous Americans have long struggled with how to relate to native peoples. Harvey Leake will discuss the friendship of his great-grandmother, Louisa Wade Wetherill, with an exceptionally wise Navajo elder named Wolfkiller, and their written account of his boyhood training that directed him to follow the “Path of Light”.

Harvey Leake, a retired electrical engineer and Prescott native, is an authority on his pioneering ancestors, the Wetherills of the Four Corners region. Through extensive research and the recollections, photographs, and memorabilia of family members, he brings their stories to life.

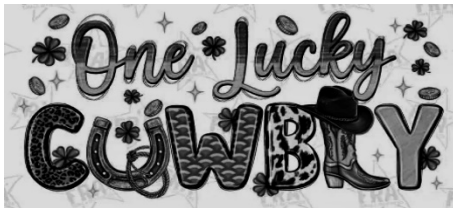
