"Fort Whipple, From 1863 to the Present"

Presenter: Worcester Bong

From its initial establishment in 1863 as a US Army post to its present-day location as a medical center serving veterans, Fort Whipple has endured several periods of transition. Worcester Bong will use photos and other images to note key people and events during the fort's 161 years of existence.

Worcester Bong worked for the Dept. of Veterans Affairs for 30 years as Chief Engineer/Facilities Manager, Facility Planner and Healthcare Specialist. Since 2019, he has been a Research Center volunteer for the Sharlot Hall and Fort Whipple Museums where he was assigned to organize the Fort Whipple-VA Center Collection. Worcester has written several historical articles for the Daily Courier's "Days Past" column.
