Presenter: Jen Bartos

Were the early settlers in Prescott concerned about their clothing fashions? Yes, they were! Jen Bartos will be sharing information and actual photographs of the clothing styles of the late 1860's-early 1870's, worn by well-known Prescottonian women and men. She will discuss how styles changed, and locals desire to follow those trends.

Jen Bartos, a 30+ year resident of Prescott, is a local business owner who has had a 40-year passion for antique clothing. She has a vast collection of women's antique periodicals and is a coordinator for the Living History program at Sharlot Hall Museum. Jen has also transcribed all of the Journal Miner newspaper articles from March, 1864 through September, 1870.
