Today, Mary Ann is President of the Prescott Frontier Days Foundation, Inc. The daughter of the 2003 Rodeo Queen will be performing at this year’s event doing trick riding. This year, Prescott’s Frontier Days Rodeo runs from June 30 to July 6th at the Rodeo grounds in Prescott.
